to bits on the shore.





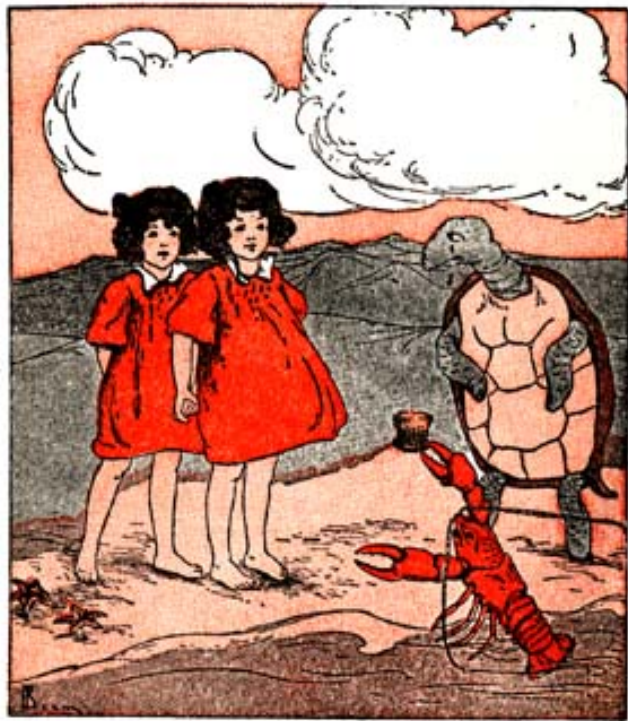
But no one was frightened.
