Said Mr. Sea Turtle, "Climb up on my shell, And I'll give you a ride. I can swim very well."



And then came along the Old Man of the Sea.






And shook out the sand from each little shoe.








And when supper was over, and prayers had been said,

She tucked them both up in their little white bed.








Three pretty sea horses came then through the foam; The Old Man of the Sea and the Urchins rode home.
